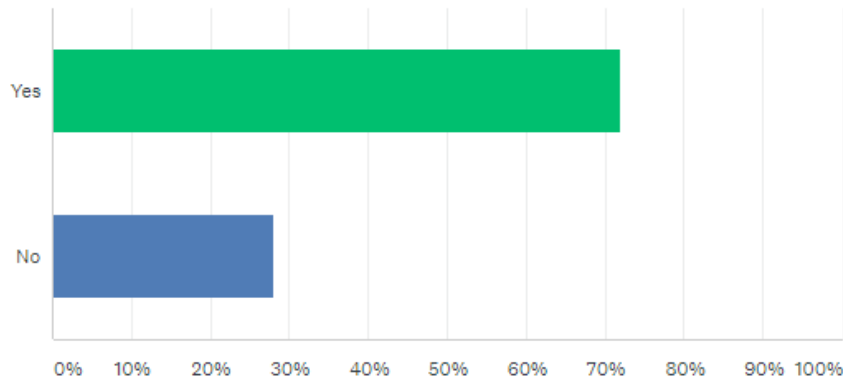


Should masks be required? If so, the Board will discuss whether masks will be made available at the door, where they will be obtained, and who will hand them out.

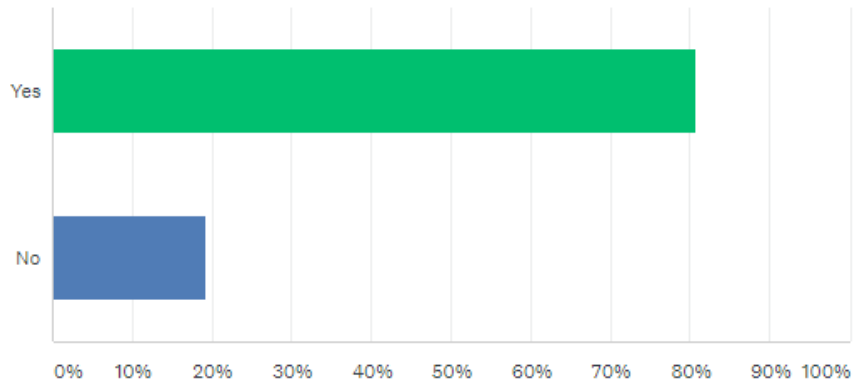

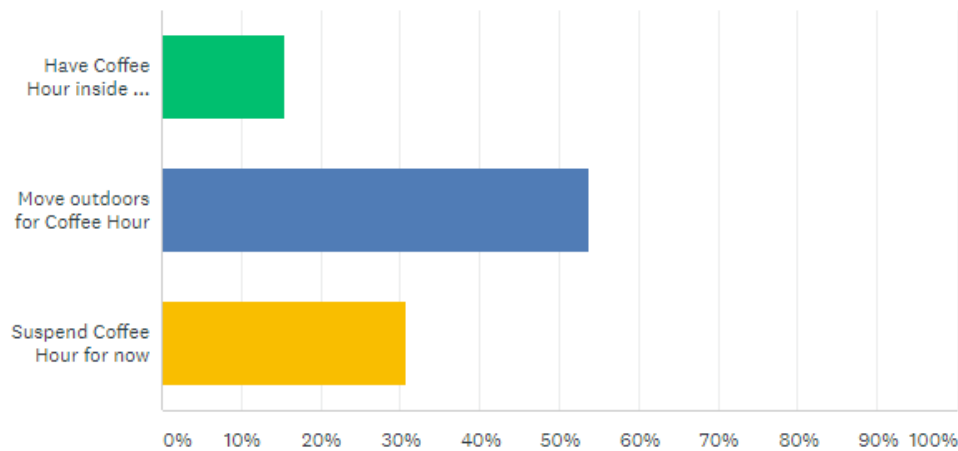

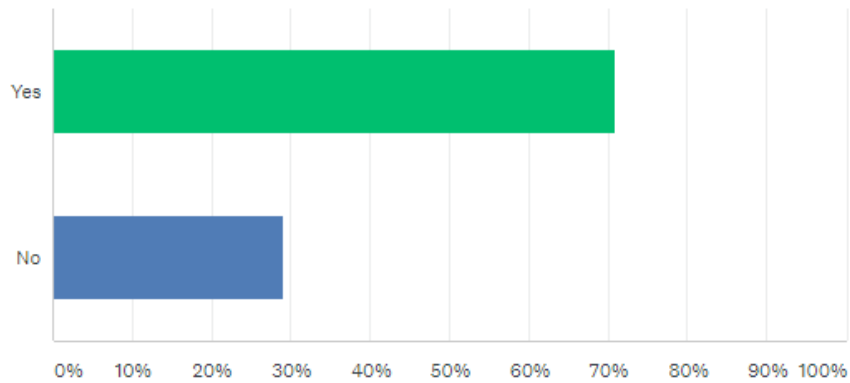

Yes. Tickets should be actively managed to allow rotation among those DDUUC members and friends who do want to attend. Administration can be helped by using free Eventbrite online ticket service and let specific people who are interested sign up in advance for limited seats. Viral load is directly proportional to the number of humans present to carry the virus. Spread is primarily airborne directly tied to how close each person is, and ventilation patterns. Breathing it in is the primary means. Secondary spread is contact with virus once it lands on surface and touching hand to nose, mouth, etc. Double Masking and frequent hand sanitizing works to cut spread because this is the main way this virus spreads. Vaccination works because this protects the person with the disease once it HAS spread.

Thanks for asking for our input. I really miss people, but the Delta and Lambda variants spread even more quickly than Covid-19 and we have so many people with their own difficult medical histories and conditions, and family situations. The virus can not tell what our political party is or whether it is one state or another. Its just looking for easy humans to go into and grow. This is an air born transmission and we need to act like it is. Please recommend and support DOUBLE MASKING. The first mask reduces the spread to other people (virus riding via droplets) and the second cuts the inhalation exposure to the wearer (virus trapped in second mask layer fibers when riding vapors and aerosols). Studies show single masking helps reduce spread to others and therefore the broad community. Studies also show that two masks dramatically improves the benefit to the mask wearer, it's just inconvenient. The CDC is in a public relations battle across the nation, but we are in a medical battle on behalf of individuals in our Church. We need to ask ourselves what works. NOT what's going to get us re-elected. Recommendation: Purchase and put a sanitizing mat at doorways. Add sanitizing spray to the mat as recommended. CDC study shows this is an effective deterrent. This will reduce virus contact spread via footwear from the world outside Church and from the Church back to our homes and families. Recommendation: Only run the fans on low, if at all. Air circulation is good but you want to reduce the time that the virus in vapor, aerosols, and droplets remains air born. Fans blades should be included in weekly cleaning/sanitizing after services. Any fans in the windows should be mounted so they vent outside. Withdraw air from the room and vent it to the outside. Turn off the venting fans facing the walkway when people are entering and leaving the Church. Good luck with all this. It's not easy.
